Career Paths for Finance (7001632–4) is English for Specific Purposes (ESP) course delivered online to the male and female students of the Economics and Islamic Finance College by ELC through E-learning system in the second semester that offers and provides a new educational resource for finance professionals who want to improve their English communication in a work environment. Incorporating career-specific vocabulary and contexts, each unit offers step-by-step instruction that immerses students in the four key language components: reading, listening, speaking and writing.
