Course Catalog Description

Medical English (4800173 – 4) is an English for Specific Purposes (ESP) course which runs in the second semester of every year beginning in February. The course is offered in 16 weeks with a 16-hour-perweek intensive teaching plan. We use a professional careers curriculum provided by Oxford University Press consisting of two textbooks: *Oxford English for Careers: Nursing 1 and Nursing 2*. In order to be enrolled in this course, students have to complete the pre-required EGP course (**English Language**, **4800170 – 6**).

The course **Medical English (4800173-4)** is offered to students enrolled in the second semester of the Common First Year. This course is directed to students who are going to pursue their studies in the various medical and health colleges (e.g., Medicine and Medical Sciences, Dentistry, Physiotherapy, Health Administration, Pharmacology... etc.). The course prepares students for their core courses which are taught in the English medium providing them with the necessary jargon and with opportunities to practice all the four language skills in a meaningful, subject-specific, context.



Performance Objectives

By the end of the course, the students are expected to be able to:

- 1. express themselves in medical situations.
- 2. communicate in medical contexts via listening, speaking, writing, emailing, reporting information, expressing opinions, etc.
- 3. use the medical terminology and structures acquired through communicative activities in medical settings.
- 4. comprehend main ideas and details in medical texts.
- 5. differentiate between the correct usage and incorrect usage of English in grammar, vocabulary, collocation, and speech situations all within the medical context.
- 6. compare and contrast textual information in different contexts, cultures, and settings.
- 7. write a correspondence, a paragraph, an essay, a short medical report, a/n formal/informal letter/email coherently and cohesively
