English 101 is a university requirement course for students enrolled in non-scientific programs. It provides beginner level English that is suitable for adults who know a little about English. An important part of the course deals with everyday English covering *survival skills* (e.g. numbers, saying dates, filling in forms, asking for directions), *social skills* (e.g. social expressions and greetings), and *functional skills* (e.g. making requests, going shopping, and saying how you feel). The course also provides students with basic vocabulary that is graded and recycled throughout, so that students do not feel overloaded. Basic grammar is focused on such as, *to be*, present simple, past simple, *there is/are, can/can't*, *I'd like*.
