The course starts with a complete overview of all English tenses: the present, perfect, past, and future tenses in the active voice and then in the passive voice along with the different modal auxiliaries. After completely discussing tense (in the indicative mood) in English, students are introduced to the subjunctive mood in the context of conditional sentences. Finally, more complex clauses are contrasted so students can distinguish between adverbial and adjectival clauses
