
















It is a secondary source which do not report new experimental work. It shows the gap between research curiosity and knowledge of the subject area.



It involves the systematic identification, location and analysis of documents containing information related to the research problem.




A literature review is usually written as a part of postgraduate thesis proposal or at the beginning of dissertation.


"The review of the literature provides the background and context for the research problem. It should establish the need for the research and indicate that the writer is knowledgeable about the area." (Wiersma,




Steps of Literature Review












Surveyed material must have been based upon genuinely original and true facts or data to make them valid and reliable.



Resources of Literature Review




Content of the Review





Literature reviews encourages deep learning and provid and efficient way to assess students on their knowledge.










Enhances analytical skills through identifying differences in previous work



Life long learning can be promoted through proper supervision








It is time consuming for the Teachers to correct and provide feedback.

Characteristics of a Good Quality Review of Literature

- A good review of literature must be comprehensive.
- It should include up-to-date references.
- It should be systemic.
- It should be reproducible.
- It should be free from bias.
- It should be well written.
- It should be in the form of sum of its parts.
- It should be clearly searched and selected.
- Accurate references should be given in the review.
