Executive Synthesis: Brief Results and Strategic Imperatives

This synthesis consolidates performance data from student course evaluations across the First, Second, and Third Semesters (461, 462, 463) of the 2024-2025 academic year, including the Islamic Architecture program (Plan 37) and Architecture and Planning program (Plan 44). The overall findings indicate a high level of student satisfaction and achievement of learning outcomes, with averages exceeding 90% across most courses.

It is recommended to sustain the current teaching strategies and assessments to maintain high student satisfaction, while introducing more interactive activities and workshops to engage students further. Additional support should be provided for CLOs where weaker performance is observed. Teamwork, communication, and presentation skills can be strengthened through group projects, and stronger industry engagement can be pursued via guest lectures and site visits. Student feedback should continue to be monitored to support ongoing improvement, and English proficiency enhanced by integrating more language-based tasks.
