The course focuses on current theories of language testing within contemporary applied linguistics, and provides students with essential knowledge and practical skills in the area of language test design, administration, and evaluation of language proficiency.

The *course* examines mainly *testing* techniques and procedures, general principles and stages of English *language test* construction, qualities of tests, such as validity, reliability and practicality.

2. Course Main Objective

- The main purpose of this course is to make students aware of the role of testing as a method of assessment. Indeed, it aims at developing students' knowledge of testing including testing types, techniques, stages, overall construction and administration qualities and possible effects.
