1. Course Description

The course is designed as a one-semester course for 6th –level B.A. students. This means that there will be 15 classes of two hours each. It introduces learners to translation from English into Arabic through a wide range of practical exercises. With a variety of texts and multiple drills, it is hoped that learners will be able to develop and refine their translation skills. It introduces the students to the translation of texts within basic genres, and covering translation sub-skills. It familiarizes them with the different typology of Arabic and English texts and also equips them with some necessary translation skills.

2. Course Main Objective

- To demonstrate knowledge of the basic principles of translation.
- To develop an understanding of theoretical frameworks in translation in order to be able to describe the techniques of translation.
